be noted, that's why he's going for it. And as I look around the Chamber, it's why all, except four, four principled people, will go for it. Four principled people, three of them in the culture corner, one worthy of being in the culture corner. But, as I said earlier, if you draw a straight line from Senator Suttle right through my chair, you'll reach the third person and we form the axis. Then Senator Beutler, to give balance, is bringing up the rear, more or less. (Laughter) But if we were all free, for whatever reasons, to do what our good sense tells us to do, we would not pass this bill. We would leave that money, as Senator Price discussed, in a pot where, taken altogether, it's enough to do something with. It's enough to make an impact somewhere. It's enough which, when spent properly, can be shown to have benefited the populace of this state. But rather than do that, we're going to fritter it...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...away and nobody is going to have anything significant and an opportunity to do something worthwhile will be lost, and I think that is not a wise policy to pursue. Therefore, I'm going to vote against the advancement of this bill as a protest, because I know the A bill must follow the other bill as night follows day, as curds are found with whey, based on this little article I got. So I expect to be the only "no" vote on this one, but I mean everything that I did say.
