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maybe some of you felt that, who voted red, that it does allow the public the opportunity to come forward. I wasn't so sure with interim zoning how that actually works. And so in a moment I'm going to give Senator Schimek some of my time because, as I understand, she's been asking that question how that will happen. I don't know if this will have any more support than the last. It may not. You know, that happens, but at least I would hope that those of you who have listened to this, have listened carefully and tried to decide if it is good government to allow the people who do not have an opportunity where they are not zoned or to have interim zoning to come forward to a state agency and ask for information and get information face to face rather than having to go with written comment. I think there are many people who are very apprehensive about writing in to a state agency for any number of reasons. And, as Senator Preister stated and I was going to when Senator Bruning said that attorneys do this all the time, yes, and sometimes we regular citizens have to pay attorneys big dollars because we're apprehensive about what we may be able to articulate or not articulate that they're trained to do with written letters and comments. And I believe that the citizens in those counties would be very apprehensive to write. I've said, well, in a lighthearted moment, maybe we could just have 1-800 number. Then we could have the opportunity to call in and ask your questions. But I do believe for those of you who weren't on the floor before, we talked about the hearings that we conducted across the state and the level of expertise that's really out there with people in asking very detailed questions and asking DEQ why or why not they would support a certain recommendation is an avenue and a forum that is very positive, it's very good, and actually, in the end, if we're going to go forward with a livestock, large livestock containment operation, I think serves the industry better. Because once you shut the public out I think you will always, always have very negative feelings with regard to that new operation. I think there are people who would come forward at that public forum and walk away thinking perhaps this will be good for my county and they would be supportive. I think you do not allow that type of forum to take place. And as I've said, if...I think that the lobby has had tunnel vision on this issue. I think, in the end, it could serve the industry very well. I think, in the end, it could serve DEQ very well. And I know, in the end, it would serve the
