Parks Commission is not opposing this amendment. They'll work with it either way, and I just wanted to make that clarification for the record, lest anyone be...misinterpret my comments. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on the Bromm amendment? Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BROMM: I would...I will go ahead and close, Mr. Speaker. I was thinking about a call of the house but, hopefully, some people are listening and will come back in to vote one way or the other and if we need a call of the house, I'll ask for one later. Just to summarize, this would provide a \$10 fee for any person who wished to take the boater safety course that's contemplated by this bill, and that course would be for those persons who wish to ride personal watercraft, who are under 16 years of age. We would have some contract instructors, some volunteer instructors, and the way it would work, the way it's envisioned would be that when the young person has completed the safety course they'd be issued a paper by the instructor indicating they've passed the course, taken the course. That would be then sent in to the Game and Parks with \$10 and they'd issue the certificate, and so the money would be held and administered by Game and Parks. With that, I would ask for the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to LB 176. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. We're voting on the Bromm amendment. Please vote if you care to. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The Bromm amendment is adopted. Next amendment.
