I circulated the number 85, which was treated as a source of humor; 30, 35 and 40 is more like it. And if we're going to start doing this by age, let's get some of these 12-, 13- and 14-year-olds off the tractors. A jet ski is a relatively harmless thing. You go out to Branched Oak, there's a lot of them out there, young kids. Some of them last summer were younger than 14, I'm sure. Now I have to digress here for just a moment. I'm under coercion. Senator Vrtiska said that I had to declare a conflict of interest. My conflict of interest is a recently-acquired step-granddaughter who happens to be 14 and who's only been on jet skis for a couple of years. I think if we want to deny these kids a good time in the summertime, we shouldn't stop with jet skis. Let's get schools of piranha in there. That'll bring them up short. Let's take the fun out of this thing. That's what we're here for. But a 14-year-old is a pretty responsible young person when they're on jet skis. I've observed them up at Lewis and Clark. They're certainly not going 85 miles an hour. I don't think Slow Motion which was, I believe, Guy Lombardo's speedboat, could go 85 miles an hour.
