manufacturer of personal watercraft in this county asked the industry to voluntarily limit speeds of jet skis to 65 miles per hour. So obviously they're operated at an excess of 65 if you have the leading manufacturer of jet skis saying that the industry should voluntarily limit the speed to 65 miles per hour. And I think that Senator Schmitt pretty well hit the nail on the head and that is, would we turn 14-year-old kids loose on any type of motorcycle or machine of that type that would go 65 mile an hour? I would respond to Senator Tyson that he talked about getting young kids off of tractors. I learned to drive a tractor when I was 12 years old, but it was an old Allis Chalmers and it'd barely go ten mile an hour. I wasn't really very reckless on it because it wouldn't go any faster than that. Now I know tractors go faster than that today and I'm sure that there are 12-year-olds and 14-year-olds that are driving tractors, but those are usually in the fields and under supervision of their father, as I learned. I don't think that's a good comparison and I...I have never seen a tractor towing a water skier, although maybe Senator Tyson has. (Laughter) We've got a piece of machinery here that, according to the industry itself, should be limited to 65 miles per hour. Obviously, that is a machine that people need to be trained, with due reference to safety, to operate. I think that it is not unreasonable to ask that somebody be 16. And the practical matter is that if you set the age limit at 16, then you can refer to a driver's license. If you set it at 14 and you have Game and Parks officials or other law enforcement officers checking ages, how do you prove you're 14? It's a real problem in enforcement, and it isn't going to deprive them of much. They can wait till they're 16 and take the course and enjoy it. So I...I strongly urge you to support Senator Bohlke's amendment, first of all to make this apply to jet skis only, personal watercraft, and then the amendment to set the age at 16, and I think we can just have a regular up and down vote on this. It's a policy decision. I've discussed this with some of you. Some of you believe that it should definitely be 14, others of you strongly believe, as I do, it should be 16. I think all we need to do is count the red and the green lights and determine what the policy of this state should be. Thank you.
