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That's what we've been talking about. CHARTS stands...I think it's an acronym for Children Have a Right to Support, I believe I've been told, but anyway the CHARTS program is what I'm assuming this goes to. Maybe we just need some more answers. But the cost for system development equipment is 6.77 million in Fiscal Year 2000, and 4.23 million plus in Fiscal Year 2001. We're not taking all their money, by any stretch of the imagination here. We're just paring it back some. And I...if I thought this would absolutely guarantee the thing would be up and running I wouldn't probably propose this amendment, but I...I don't have that kind of faith in them over there. And I think that we're not asking an impossible task here to be done. We're simply cutting funds back from 6.7 million to 4.7 million in one year and from...down to 3.0...3.01 million the second year. So it's not like we're leaving them with a bare cabinet. They still have a total of \$7 million when you include the federal funds in there. And so I think it's still a reasonable...reasonable approach to take and would ask your support for this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Discussion on Amendment 1886, Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President, members. Senator Wehrbein, if you would yield to a question, please.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I think part of the discussion here, and we need to clarify it, people are frustrated by the amount of money that's been spent. What have we spent for N-FOCUS, CHARTS and JUSTICE, 60 million?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I don't have that figure. Probably would be close, 50 to 60 between the three, because I know N-FOCUS is over 20.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yeah, I...I think it was even maybe closer to 70 million. I was trying to...
