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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I just don't have them. I wouldn't...I really have no basis to disagree with you.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And I think that's the frustration. Now we did have a meeting and had the people coming in that were running those three systems to do some education on that, and they are...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And we're having our briefing tomorrow, I'm...may I interrupt,...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...so I'm not up...

SENATOR BOHLKE: We had all the senators. We invited the senators in and they came in and I know the Health and...or the Appropriations Committee and they were also doing one for the Health Committee. I think that's part of the frustration. I think it would be dangerous to go the route of the Baker amendment, as far as how the federal government may perceive that. I also think it may slow down Douglas County, and I think the people here representing Douglas County have to realize Douglas County is not on JUSTICE and they...this is going to cost Douglas County a great deal of money. People have said that the system that they are using is a superior one because it's faster. At our hearing, what we found out is that that's not necessarily true; it's that they have been not entering the same amount of information that they're going to be required to enter under the new guidelines. And so, in fact, that the system that Douglas County has been using may not be any faster than N-FOCUS, CHARTS, or JUSTICE, and I do think that there could be some danger that Douglas County may not move forward as quickly as they should be moving forward if we didn't provide this money. The only thing that I would say, and that I had said to the Governor yesterday when we were talking about ESUs, is if we wanted to look, the only place in the whole state where technology is working happens to be in our schools with the ESUs, so maybe what we should do is take the 2 million, give it to the ESUs, let them take it over (laugh) and we'd get it done and up and running. But I don't think we want to go that direction either, and so I do...I don't support Senator Baker's
