SENATOR HARTNETT: But...but with your amendment adopted, it would be over 12 units, is that, in this...this first part?

SENATOR TYSON: And that is...

SENATOR HARTNETT: I...I would think...

SENATOR TYSON: ...that is the line of demarcation for NIFA, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah. I would think that city councils would look at...would have questions, if new projects are coming in from the housing authority, I think if there...you know, worth (inaudible)...

SENATOR TYSON: That's my, Senator Hartnett, that is my point entirely.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Well, that's...

SENATOR TYSON: If they do have questions, they have to have something in front of them that they can identify, that they can analyze, that they can reason from in making their decision.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I think that's already in the bill, Senator Tyson. But, we disagree.

SENATOR TYSON: Well, then I...I'm...I'm happy for Senator Hartnett's declaration of support for this. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Brown, you're recognized on the amendment. Senator Brown, on FA244.
