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can be privy to the information that we've talked about in the previous amendments that we adopted on General File. That information will be out there for them. It will be out there for decision-makers. It will be out there for individuals in the development community who are...who would want to partner with a public housing authority. It would be available through the amendments that we adopted on General File that call for the filing of the plans that...that the housing authorities are already developing and are already...already have the process in place to develop. And so we are not creating yet another hoop for them. We are not inventing something just to make it problematic. We are taking something that they already have to do that is a very complete kind of analysis of the community, and a complete setting out of their plans for addressing particular needs in the community. Those are being filed, and will be available. It is just making sure that what we are not...that we are not just making it problematic and making it difficult and making it expensive and making it a hoop. So we have in place what we need. We do not need the Tyson amendment. And I would urge you to not support the Tyson amendment, to remember what we did on General File and to move forward with this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Tyson, your light is on, but it's the only light on. Did you wish to close, or did you....

SENATOR TYSON: I'll...I'll close. The purport of my amendment really comes down, if you want to look on page 79, Section 72. Senator Hartnett need not refer to it, because he's already got two amendments on it. What this does, it provides the details of the plans that would be contained in the market study. Senator Hartnett has, on his amendment 1819, reference to housing or commercial purposes or any combination of such purposes. There has to be a plan indicating location or locations or boundaries of the proposed sight, so on and so forth. All of that would be contained in the market study. What are you going to study in a market study? The market, the uses, the location, the impact on the community, the justification, exactly what it says, to justify any such new development, or as required by NIFA. This merely spells it out. Why Senator Brown feels that...evidently, Senator, and I don't
