SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. It is withdrawn. Senator Beutler, on the Tyson amendment to LB 105. Senator...Mr. Clerk, you have another amendment?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, I do have another amendment to this portion of the divided amendment. This one is offered by Senator Tyson. It's FA243. (See amendment on page 2253 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson, you're recognized to open on your amendment to your amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment referred to, and if you'll look on your screen, page 2, line 18, this is nothing more than the exact same phrase that we discussed earlier and inserted into Section 6. After the word "developments" insert "that involve 12 or more units". This again is a requirement of NIFA and, for all the reasons that I outlined previously, this serves exactly the same purpose, it raises the threshold on this project, and for all intents and purposes inserts the requirements that NIFA now has. And I ask for your support. Thank you.
