SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, what does this tell you? What does this tell you? Senator Chambers, thank God he went through it, but as you all know, he has a particular focus, we all have different focuses in here. He focused just on tenant's rights, just on one small aspect of the bill, page 1, page 2, page 3, page 4, 33 amendments. And I tell you, as I looked at other sections of the bill, I can come with at least that many or more, as you look at different aspects of the bill. When I was faced with this yesterday this was, I mean, we get to the end of the session here and we can't really deal with all the bills well. And we're faced with the dilemma of putting forth something that we know is not good, or holding it for a year. And I think we ought to hold this one for a year. After the lunch hour, I hope there will be a bracket motion offered. I'll offer it, if nobody else offers it. Let's see where we are on this. Do you really want to put this out this year? And if you do, that's fine, and I'll turn my mind to those amendments to try to make it better before it goes out on the floor of the Legislature. But let me tell you, it's not a matter of filibustering at all, this thing is filled with, I think, things you will not like. And here are 31 of them related to tenants alone. And the lobby says, oh, they're all fine, even took out some current law for Ernie, so eager were they to divide the opposition. Well, I praise Ernie, but the message is clear, isn't it? Isn't the message really clear? Thank you.
