CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bruning would move to recess until 1:30 p.m.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Good afternoon. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. We will call this afternoon's business to order. Members, would you please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Thank you.

CLERK: 34 ayes...I'm sorry, Mr. President. I have a quorum present.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Are there any items for the record?

CLERK: I have no items at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: This afternoon's agenda.

CLERK: Mr. President, believe the first item for consideration or potential...or motions, I should say, to override certain gubernatorial line-item vetoes. The first such motion I have is from Senator Thompson. Senator Thompson would move that with respect to LB 878, Section 8, Agency 25, Program 931, Juvenile Correctional Facilities, those provisions become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
