for the purposes of renovating the hall, but rather reconsider our position and do consider, from the standpoint of the administration, new construction because the place is overcrowded. It's used far more than what it was ever designed for, and that's the whole facility. I think we could do much better on both the Kearney and Geneva facilities. So, with that, I would have supported the override motion on this particular case, but I guess that's not going to be available to us. But I would hope that another look is made at how we're spending what money is available and if it might be better in another year to spend a little more money and have a better value. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. This yellow form, \$95 million spent on adult corrections in the last few years, and what we are talking about in this particular part that was vetoed out was a new replacement construction, not new construction. Everything on this yellow sheet was not replacement. It was new construction. I'm going to support the Governor's veto on it, but I did have a question of Senator Thompson, if she would...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Thompson, can you yield?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

Where does that leave us now as far as the housing that the state should be furnishing for the juvenile facil...juvenile courts in...well, I think everybody's sitting there except Douglas County and Lancaster County, obviously, as you know, has out-of-state, out-of-home placements that the state is not paying for and I think should be paying for. Will that be part of this coming back too as...
