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I just want to stand and thank Nancy Thompson, or Senator Thompson, about raising this issue up because I think that it's really important. I was another one that went out to the area and looked it over, and all the things that's been said is true. And I think that we should use this 600,000, if they're going to spend it, and I think we should use in the right direction because, far as I'm concerned, they should a started over on a new building and not spend this money out there on a building. This hasn't been mentioned yet, but there's two or three stories to this building and you can take the crew that would run it, just cuts it in half if you just have it all on one floor. Because you cannot watch three floors without somebody on every floor, and that hasn't been brought out yet and I think that's real important. And I think that we should consider this money back in there so we can go ahead and build in place of just fixing up, fixing up, because I'm afraid that the fixing's not going to be done like it should be done. But, anyway, I appreciate again and I think everything's been said, but I appreciate Senator Thompson bringing this and I hope that everybody will pay attention to what's been said. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yeah, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members, I was sitting here with one of the best salesman that ever existed in the state, Gene Tyson, and he counts and sells steel by the pound and knows square foot costs and the rest, and we were just doing some numbers in our head here. Interestingly enough, we thought we'd share them with you. And are we right that \$600,000, at about \$65 a square foot, would build how many square feet? About 8,000 square feet. If each girl, we got 30 girls on an average to take care of and there are 30 girls and we could use, say, 300 square feet for each girl, we could build a motel like on one floor level thing for \$600,000 with brand new rooms and brand new bathrooms and the whole ball of wax. If this is, in fact, a minimum security type facility and, in fact, I understand some of these girls do go to town to work every day, if that's right, I don't know why the \$600,000, rather than remodeling a building that has really no economic value or life to it to begin with and wouldn't be improved much with sending 600,000, why we couldn't do that to build a motel, like, on one story, courtyard type building that could work very well. I
