

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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LB 105

on AM1862 to LB 105.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, what I have to say before I get on that is that the best line of the day was when my seatmate, Senator Thompson, said, I shall croak from the Governor's letter, and she promptly proceeded to go. Now, there's a song called "It Might As Well Be Spring" and one of the lines says, I haven't seen a crocus or a rosebud. Well, I've seen a crocus this afternoon (laugh), or I haven't seen one but I heard one. Members of the Legislature, before we left this morning for...we...we recessed, I had given an explanation of the amendment that I have offered and I went through some of the types of provisions that it contains and am I closing?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: You are not closing, unless you wish to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. Well, if there are no lights on, yes, this is my closing. I hope that in view of the fact that those who have spoken about this amendment very briefly have praised the amount of work done on the amendment, the thrust of it, and I hope you will adopt it. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you for that closing, Senator Chambers. Question before us is the adoption of AM1862 to LB 105. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Jones. Senator, I have AM1870, but I have a note that, as a substitute, you would like to offer AM1895.

SENATOR JONES: That's correct.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: It is withdrawn and if there's no objection, substitution is granted. Senator Jones. I'm sorry, Senator Schimek, you're...Senator Schimek, to open on AM1895.
