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grandfathering. Is that correct? Could I ask Senator Schimek a question, please?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Senator Vrtiska, restate your question, please.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, it says "constructed or acquired". That means that if you own the property and it was actually under the grandfather but you sold it, the new person would not be able to qualify under the grandfather. Is that what that means?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is...that would be my reading of this, yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Your reading, but is that what it means?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That...that is...yes, that is right, I believe.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, that's the way I read it, but I was curious because you're saying that none of these...any property that would change hand then would lose its...its grandfather rights.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is...well, no. I mean, are you talking property in terms of an actual development, or are you talking about, say,...

SENATOR VRTISKA: The facility.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...land?

SENATOR VRTISKA: I'm talking about the facility.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, no, it wouldn't lose, not...I don't believe, that if you...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, that's what it says. It's...
