SENATOR SMITH: If Senator Jones would yield for a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Jones?

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I will.

SENATOR SMITH: Now, when you were explaining a half constructed or...project, can you tell me again where you were coming from on that?

SENATOR JONES: If they're building a project before this takes place, you know, and they got half done, well, then it should be all grandfathered in. But if they quit on it and say, well, we don't know when we're going to build any more, then they decide, in two years later, that they build more or add to it, then that should be under the new part.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. I see where you're coming from there and I guess I'll continue to look forward to perhaps some details that answers my prior question. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schmitt (sic)...Smith. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Schimek, on the Schimek amendment. Senator Schimek waives. Senator Brown, on the Schimek amendment to LB 105.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I wondered if Senator Schimek would yield to a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek, can you yield to a question? You're easy to spot with that jacket on.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, I...and I apologize to the body. I am checking on explanations and that's why I'm out in the lobby, so I will try to answer any question, but I'm not sure I have the full answer yet. So who's asking the question?
