want to see, all of a sudden, a bunch of land purchased to initiative some projects so that there will be several projects, quote, underway, unquote, to avoid the guidelines set forth in this perhaps new statute. And so I think that's why we maybe need to define what...what types of developments we're talking about, in terms of what's completed, how do we define "completed" and how do we define some of the other items in this amendment so that we can just clarify and make sure that everyone knows ahead of time what's going on here and we're not left with a bunch of loopholes that could happen without defining some of these terms. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Schimek, your light is the only one on. Would you like to close? Before you proceed, Mr. Clerk, I understand there's an item on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schimek would move to amend her amendment, in line 6 of that amendment, after the word "acquired" insert "and substantially occupied". (FA248 is found on page 2258 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on your amendment to Amendment 1895.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I hope this will bring some clarity to what we're discussing here. There's two places in my amendment that you would enter the words "and substantially occupied". It's after "acquired" in line 6 and after "acquired" in line 12. And what that...what that will do, I believe, is identify those projects that are truly underway and that they won't be some that somebody's trying to rush in at the last minute and get them grandfathered in. They have to be substantially occupied. They have to be something that truly is a work that is completed and construction...constructed and occupied. It's not something that somebody could have on the drawing board in the hopes of getting grandfathered in. Now I hope...I hope that answers your questions and I can see where you...where the confusion was, but it's...there's nothing tricky about this. We're just trying to take care of those projects that are already out there.
