SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, and members of the body, I simply rise also to support this part of it. We're talking about a housing authority or a housing agency, I guess the name is going to be changed to housing agency, and rather than allow them or expand into this area of commercial, I guess I have...and so I simply think that's wrong I guess, and so I simply rise and support Senator Beutler's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I believe the amendment is understood, Mr. President. I'd certainly appreciate whatever support you all could give us.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. The question is the adoption of Amendment 1898 to LB 105. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have amendment from Senator Beutler, Senator, floor...I'm sorry, AM1899.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, to open on Amendment 1899.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is the second big chunk that I think, hopefully for all of you, it'd make it a much, much more liveable bill, and that is to take out of the bill all of the language except that which is federally required relating to the expansive view of what a housing authority could do. In other words, it eliminates all the language, again, except what's required by the federal government having to do with social programs above and beyond the providing of affordable housing and those things that are very closely related to that. It's...it's not an easy line to draw, but I'm suggesting to you that if you take the things out
