the committee amendments, so I would suggest that we adopt the corrective amendment first, and then I'd be happy to respond to questions about the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Mr. Clerk, is there an amendment on the desk?

CLERK: Senator Coordsen would move to amend the committee amendments, Mr. President. (AM1814. See page 2223 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Coordsen to open on your amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Again, this amendment is...has been filed, and it's on the laptop. And on page 2, line 3, beginning with "residential property", through the "the", it strikes that and replaces it with "the land on which". So it would read: the farmstead site shall mean the land on which residential and agricultural property are sited, if they're used, et cetera. And then it strikes, on line 8, from "who", through the end of line 9. This is somewhat redundant language, and we thought that striking that would, in fact, make the bill...the committee amendment a little more understandable, read a little cleaner. So that is...and then on the back...on the last page, page 3 of the committee amendment, line 10, it strikes "real property" and replaces that with "land". So I would ask for the adoption of the committee...of my amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Janssen, did you wish to speak to the amendment to the amendment, or on the committee amendments? Your light is on.

SENATOR JANSSEN: To the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay. Senator Bromm, did you wish to speak to the...okay. Senator Coordsen, do you wish to close? Senator Coordsen waives closing. The question before the body is, shall the Coordsen amendment to the committee amendments to LB 419 be adopted? All in favor vote aye; opposed nay.
