SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Chairman, I'd request a division of the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, I have reviewed this and I agree that it is divisible. Would you like to explain the division?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, please. The division is...I believe it is satisfactory to the Chair and to Senator Kristensen, and I'm reading from AM1827, the first portion would begin at the beginning on line 1 and would continue through the semicolon on line 10. And the second division would begin at that semicolon in line 10 and continue through the end of the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Kristensen, would you like to add to that or?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I would agree. I think that's a proper division.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Kristensen, which one would you like to take up first, FA251 and FA252, part one or part two?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I am not sure which number goes with which part, but let's take up the part that deals with the first ten lines on the definition. That would be the easiest to start with.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That would be FA251 would be part one. (See page 2270 of the Legislative Journal.) Discussion on FA251. Senator Brashear, your light is on.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Chairman, thank you. Members of the body, I would rise in support of the first division, FA251. This is a refined, improved, more complete and thorough definition which would be substituted for that contained in the committee amendment. All interested parties are supportive of that definitional change, and I would urge the adoption of FA251. Thank you.
