1997 to the Board of Educational Lands and Funds Program Evaluation Unit Final Report, on pages 40 and 41, I'm going to quote a little bit of this and try to be as short as I can here. "The Constitution authorizes the Legislature to determine the use of the income from unsold school lands, arguably to include a determination of the amount to be deducted to pay for the administrative costs of the board. The Board of Educational Lands and Funds is currently able to tap directly into money generated by school land leases for its administrative expenses, without legislative appropriation, as a result of legislative acquiescence. It was the Legislature and not the courts which in 1978 since...up to 1978 that had been appropriated money, but since 1978 after years of making General Fund appropriations for the administrative expenses of the board, authorized the board to pay its administrative costs directly from receipts generated by leases on school land. It should not be interpreted as an indication that the board has constitutional status analogous to that ascribed to the Board of Regents by the Nebraska Supreme Court in Exon. That's the case that they're going to say gives them the right to set their own budget. Further, the law though continues to direct that an amount be appropriated by the Legislature to cover the board's administrative costs. However, in what may well be misplaced reliance on Exon, the Legislature has not limited the Board of Educational Lands and Funds' administrative expenses through the appropriations process since 1978. So this amendment will take back some control that we had previous to 1978. I guess I would say we're going to hand the football back to them and if they don't like it, they can try and convince the courts otherwise. But this is from the program evaluation done by the Legislature, dated February, 1997. My case...to make my case here, the average salaries of the Board of Educational Lands and Funds are the fourth highest of all government agencies. And when I say the fourth highest, the only people above them are actually the Lieutenant Governor's office, the Ethanol Board, Wheat Board, people of agencies with simply an executive director. So I believe it's high time we got control of this back into the Legislature. I think maybe people could make a case for nonfeasance of duty to the Legislature if we don't do this. When we bring out the fact that they're the fourth highest of average salary, government salaries, of all agencies, and I know that it was directed by the Legislature that they begin selling this school land and
