And in order to do that, I wanted the finding to be that everybody else was equal before an order would take place.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, I understand your concern. And I have no idea who's a good actor and who's a bad actor. But whether you leave the word "state" in there or whether you change it to "county", if your objective is that everybody be a good actor, it seems to me that the effect of the amendment is the opposite, because it doesn't allow you to address or force action of any bad actor anywhere anytime. So it looks to me to be counterproductive. But I...but I'll be listening. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. There were no lights on. Senator Quandahl, did you wish to say anything in closing on your amendment...pardon me, on the motion to return?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes. Just briefly on the motion to return. And you know, quite frankly, from some of the discussion here, I'm not sure if I have the votes to return this to Select File for this amendment. But the reason behind the amendment is just to create that proverbial level playing field that I've heard so much about since I've been here in the Legislature. And all it asks is that all citizens of the state of Nebraska, and that would include Douglas County, that would include Sioux County, every county in between, are treated the same. And that is why I would ask you to vote yes for the return to Select File for the amendment that we talked about. And that's my closing. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. The question before the body is the return to Select File of LB 32. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. A roll call vote has been requested. Okay. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 2332-2333.) 15 ayes, 29 nays on the motion to return.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The motion fails. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
