procedurally. I'm told by the people that do these things that that's an acceptable process. So that would be the second alternative. But I would rather not do that. I would rather look at the problem in more detail, take some time, see if we can't work towards a more interoperative system in DMV, for several purposes. There have been several senators who brought bills to our committee this year, Transportation, dealing with the problem of lapsed insurance and people driving without insurance. And if that problem were ever to be addressed in a comprehensive way, we would have to have a more interoperative computer system in DMV. And so that's the rationale, and I would ask you to return LB 585 for that specific purpose. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. There are no lights on. Did you wish to say anything further on your motion? Closing is waived. The motion is to return LB 585 to Select File for a specific amendment. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The bill is returned. Senator Bromm to open on your amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: I'll just simply ask the body to adopt this amendment which, again, would remove these two lines and save us about \$200,000. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: There are no lights on. Did you wish to say anything in closing? Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to LB 585. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to adopt the Select File amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Select File amendment is adopted. Senator Smith for a motion, please.
