SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, that's the only question I have.

SENATOR ENGEL: Yeah, yeah.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Wehrbein has his light on. I'll give the rest of my time to Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Bohlke, please. Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President. Senator Wehrbein, he was yielding part of the time. When I get done, if you need it...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No.

SENATOR BOHLKE: All right. There certainly has been a great deal of discussion. I would like to make a few points. Number one, the issue of insurance was there before this bill was ever considered. That was an issue that's been there, the issue of volunteer driver being covered or not covered under his own insurance company. It's not a new issue created by this bill. Also the...a number of you it was referenced had a man visit you. I think it was Senator Wehrbein's constituent. And he has his own insurance company and a taxi cab service. That man had gone to the association to bring the insurance issue up and the association did not, they refused and said that as far as they were concerned it really wasn't a problem. So you are able to get insurance. To bring back to you the point of why the bill was brought, was certainly that there are a lot of people out there well-meaning, good people, taxi cab drivers, but there have been some that there has been great abuse. And when you charge anywhere up to over \$2 per mile plus the pick-up fee and the delivery fee, that is, that's extreme. And that has been costing the state a great deal of money. I would remind you and I think this is something that maybe has not been made clear is that within the town, within the limits of their town that they serve they will still be able to charge the amount they were charging. And in addition to that, this caps it when they're traveling outside of their town, but they will still be able to cover to charge the pick-up fee and the delivery fee which I'm not sure is really fair. And so, Senator Byars, the person who talks to you who says he can't make it on 90 cents is not only
