they said that if there was not profit that was being made by the volunteers that they, anyway, would not cancel anyone's insurance for volunteering to take somebody to a hospital or to a doctor or whatever the circumstance might be. So they do need to check, however, whoever the volunteer is, with their agent to make sure the department will make them aware of that. And with that, I think we have a situation that can be handled; and I think the saving of \$350,000 certainly is significant enough that we move forward with this issue. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Senator Wehrbein, please.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, I thank you for the discussion of this. I think the issue has been laid out. I, too, want to see how things develop and will be working, and so with that, I respectfully withdraw the amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The amendment is withdrawn. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: If not, now you need to return to your seats. We are on Final Reading. With some semblance of order here, Mr. Clerk will read the bill. Okay. The first motion is the motion to dispense with Final Reading. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to dispense with Final Reading.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Read the title, please.

CLERK: (Read LB 594 by title.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Record, Mr. Clerk. Record, Mr. Clerk.
