SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Kristensen, you are recognized.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I want to announce again the schedule for next week, and so I know that everybody is anxious to leave today. It's been a long week and it's been a productive week. Next week we will meet on Monday, but we're starting at ten o'clock, so that's the first change. We'll probably work to...well, we're going to work Monday, and I anticipate stopping for lunch, but there will not be an evening meal on Monday night. Tuesday we will plan to work through the noonhour and I would hope that we could accomplish our work on Tuesday. That's the layover day if we're going to read anything for Thursday. So depending on what happens, Tuesday may not be a long day because if we get our things done on Monday, Tuesday should be an easy day. We'll recess Wednesday. We will not meet Wednesday. Then we meet Thursday for the final day, overrides of vetoes that day, and Final Reading that day. We're done with General File now as of today. The last day for Select File is going to be Monday. And so there's going to be a list on the agenda that you're going to see motions to return. If you have any Final Reading bill, whether it's eligible to be read Monday or Tuesday because we've got a bunch of bills that aren't eligible to be read on Monday that we'll read Tuesday, but if you have a motion on any Final Reading bill, those motions have to be taken up Monday, and we're going to take them up in the order that they're filed. But once we're done with those motions, and we proceed to Final Reading on Monday, then those bills can't be amended this session because we've got to have time to get them back down and for the layover day of Tuesday so they can be read on the last day. So the thing I would caution you is look at that list. If there are things that have to be brought back, they need to be brought back on Monday. Other than that, I think that's...we're going to put out an E-mail that'll...to everybody that will outline those dates again, but I just wanted to reenforce that. Thank you, Mr. President, and have a good weekend.
