SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...not necessarily expecting. But we want to be prepared for any...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...contingency that may arise.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I will add that Q1 added, however remote. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, that's all I have, Mr. President. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Kristensen, you're recognized to close. Senator Kristensen waives closing. The question is the adoption of AM1910 to LR 18CA. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend. (FA258, Legislative Journal page 2364.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is actually an amendment from myself and Senator Kristensen. First of all, I want to say that this amendment has nothing to do with the controversial portion of this particular bill, and that portion is the part or the constitutional amendment that you will recall requires two votes, an initial vote, and then, if that is a positive vote, a ratification vote. My amendment has nothing to do with that. This amendment has to do with Section 2 of the bill, which is a separate constitutional provision. And under Section 2 of the bill, it's some cleanup language and the only effective thing that it does is to require, instead of a space of four months between the
