SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think it ought to be extremely difficult to amend the constitution. I have given my reasons in the past, so I won't go into that. But I do want to comment about this initiative LB 413 that people keep talking about, and various of my colleagues suggest that it was a grassroots effort that defeated that when time came to vote for it. That's not true. There was a lot of money on the other side, but there was one organization that was the deep pockets, then a lot of other kind of hangers-on joined in, but there was money on the other side. The education lobby saw what was about to happen. Had there not been that organizational effort put forth to counteract those money-grubbers who supported LB 413, that LB 413 item would have been approved by the voters. So nobody can point to any example where grassroots efforts, or ordinary people defeated any initiative effort, no matter what the subject. As the Speaker has pointed out repeatedly, an organization can buy its way onto the ballot. I'd like to remind Senator Dierks that the first order of business whenever one of these efforts is undertaken is fund raising, get as much money as you can. "Deacon" Jones pointed out how much money is spent. So that fact is not open to dispute in my mind. Right now there is an attempt to put a term limits proposition on the ballot. At least one black woman has been imported from Washington, D.C. to organize the efforts to circulate the petitions in my district and in other parts of the black community which are not in my district. And you know what they're telling black people? It won't affect Senator Chambers, because he is going to retire. That is the official line that these people were told to use, and when they train young people in the community, they tell them to say the same thing. Some of the young people are doing this for that reason alone, plus they're given 75 cents per signature. They also, the people who are circulating this petition, misrepresent what it does. They say, the way it is now Senator Chambers can only be in office two terms. Well, I've already been in more than two. But they give the impression that there's something new on the horizon, that I can only serve two terms. If this petition is successful, then it means I can serve as many terms as the people want to put me in. So they're misrepresenting my impending retirement. Brothers and sisters, unfortunately, when I retire from this place, I will retire right into the crematorium. People in my district
