PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm?

SENATOR BROMM: The consumption would not be legal. It would be illegal under current law...

SENATOR BOHLKE: And...

SENATOR BROMM: ...and has been for a long time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And has been for a long time. And have we done anything to change that with this bill?

SENATOR BROMM: No.

SENATOR BOHLKE: So if we're concerned about that, it would have to be new legislation that would have to change current law, rather than the amendment Senator Schimek is offering on Final Reading,...and I think that's why she indicated she would probably pull it...because we would have a public hearing. But for all those people that think that we are now not going to let them do something that they wish to do, we haven't changed anything. They shouldn't be doing it now, if they're worried about breaking the law. Is that true?

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah. And I'll...Senator Schimek's amendment would change that.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right.

SENATOR BROMM: Her amendment deals with consumption, as well as the open container provision, and says that consumption in those types of vehicles, as well as the open container, would be okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Bromm. And I just turned my light on to make sure that everyone understood. And I think that's why I said Senator Schimek...and she can speak to this...may pull this, because it's an amendment, hasn't had a
