LB 816, 816A, 863

47 ayes, 0 nays, 1 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. LB 816A.

CLERK: (Read LB 816A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you voted? Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 2375.)
46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. LB 863.

CLERK: Senator Preister would move to return the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, honorable President, friends all. I rise just to make a couple of points in...on this bill, and then I will withdraw the return motion. I would like to, at this point, ask Senator Schrock a couple of questions, if I might, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schrock, would you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I will, Lieutenant Governor.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Senator Schrock. In the bill, on page 15, line 23, it reads, "Any funds applied for, received, or used by the department or any political subdivision from the federal government or any public entity may be used only to abate lead-based paint hazards and for the administration of lead-based paint programs which address health and environmental hazards caused by lead-based paint." Senator Schrock, could I
