ourself down, like Senator Coordsen said, it's a reasonable body, it's a good body and we do a good job and we need to exploit that more than we do. Again, it's the people's want and they will do it for us. If Senator Jones' 1,500 is a...or 15,000, whatever amount he has, is the right amount, so be it. But we have to make sure. We only have one shot at this. Mean, it doesn't roll around every year, one shot, so we got to make it a reasonable amount. And I think the people are going to go for it this year, next year, whenever it comes up. Like Senator Kristensen said, I forget what he said now, I guess, but it was good, whatever. Whatever you said, it was good, Senator Kristensen. But...he made a statement but I can't...well, maybe he'll do it in his next talk here. Anyway, let's go sell ourselves and the people are willing to give us a raise if it's the right amount and they absolutely will do it. Thank you.
