Shawn received his paramedic certification from Western Nebraska Community College in Scottsbluff. He has served as a firefighter and paramedic for the last 15 years and is currently a full-time paramedic with the Valley Ambulance Services in Scottsbluff, and is an EMT trainer. The second appointment is that of Ms. Kay Lynn Goldner with the State Foster Care Review Board. Kay Lynn graduated from North Platte High School, Nebraska Wesleyan University, and the Nebraska Methodist School of Nursing. She is a retired special education nurse and active in her community. She has served on the local Foster Care Review Board since 1985, a period of 14 years. The last name that we submit to you is Mr. James Ganz, Jr., State Foster Care Review Board. James was born in Lincoln, graduated from Gibbon High School and UNL College of Law. He is an attorney and operates a title insurance company in Kearney, Nebraska. He is a reappointment to the State Foster Care Review Board and chairman of his local Foster Care Review Board.
