SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Beutler, I'm sure that's an interesting question. It appears so. I can only speculate; these have both been adopted by...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...a majority view of the body; that we're not operating under the legislative rule now. We've gone beyond it. They have been adopted. Legislative rules have been passed by, complied with and passed by. We're at the finish point.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I under...I understand the difference in procedure. I'm trying to understand the difference in logic.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well, I think the difference in procedure also provides the bases for the difference in logic.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But should not the Legislature on Final Reading, if it so chose, be able to deal with an A bill with respect to particular items that might be a lesser matter than the entire matter in a main body of a bill?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I think that would be an interesting debate some time. The fact is, we haven't. Nobody's apparently challenged that. But these have both, both LB 76 and LB 76A were adopted. LB 76 was vetoed and no one is attempting to override it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: And LB 76A was passed, vetoed, and we are attempting to override it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Thank you, Senator Beutler. On the motion to override the Governor's veto of LB 76A, Senator Brashear.
