that, why, I'm going to go on. The...to me, this, as I looked at this yesterday, this was consistent. We are in the right program. We are with the right agency of state government. We are pursuing the right objective statutorily, and the only thing that needs to be derived from LB 76 are the...are the structural aspects of the study to be conducted and, quite frankly, if the Nebraska Crime Commission, we are entitled to make a record here and we are making a record as to what we want done with this money, and if the Nebraska Crime Commission didn't have reference to LB 76, I believe the concept the doctrine of proportionality is such at law that the Crime Commission would, with its own resources, come up with an appropriate study that would essentially encompass the same subparts as are set forth with specificity in LB 76. I think we're on solid ground here. I think we can get the study; that I heard a lot more people saying they wanted than we can...without the moratorium, I believe we've raised the issue in the consciousness of the people and we've begun a very, very important discussion that needs to be pursued and, for that, we have the five Nebraska Supreme Court Opinions being responsive to our statutes saying this study needs to be done. I have no indicate...well, I certainly can't represent anybody, have no indication that the executive branch would not receive this action by this body with integrity and expend the monies in pursuit of its objective. Senator Beutler, would you like to have any of my remaining time? I would yield, Mr. President, to Senator Beutler.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, two and a half minutes.
