years in the past when I know specifically that the Revenue Committee did receive more bills than the other and were able to process those and were able, I believe, to afford each of the introducers a fair and judicious hearing. I don't...we had a problem several years ago and the issue at point, the division of the question, of course, is, as I understood the explanation by the President, is the changing the name of the Transportation Committee, and there was a time in the past when it was questionable as to where issues of the electronic communication and those sorts of things went. So this particular part will not really change anything. It will maybe make a...make the role of Transportation Committee more understandable on the outside. It really won't change anything in the manner of referencing, because we already do that. Again, I would be not, I think, carrying out my responsibilities to myself if I didn't close by saying I, again, appreciate the serious work, the considerations of the committee, of the Rules Committee and the work of Senator Wickersham and his staff, but I find myself in the position of, this morning, not being in favor of any of the changes that are proposed. But I'm certainly willing to listen to all of the arguments that will exist over the next rest of this morning or the week as it goes. Thank you, Mr. President.
