SENATOR BROMM: The number.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...changing the number of members?

SENATOR BROMM: If we adopt the rest of the rule proposal. However, if we just adopt this subsection, of course, it's just a name change.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But doesn't this subsection...let me look at it. What I'm looking at would be a change in Rule 3, Section 3, which would be the second page of this handout we got, and it's talking about the Standing Committees and it changes the name of the Transportation Committee to Transportation and Telecommunications, and also changes the number of members from eight to nine.

SENATOR BROMM: I would like clarification on it, Senator Chambers. My understanding, when I listened to the description of the division, was that this first division only dealt with the name change and that the rest of the changes in that section fell into the third category of changes. I would need a clarification on that if you're correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I will ask the Chair for clarification. Is the number of members not a part of this part that we're considering right now?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: As I indicated prior to your beginning this five-minute speaking session, Senator Chambers, the divided question before us includes both the name change and the change in the number of members.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I thought I heard, but I wanted to be sure so that we all know what it is that we're dealing...thank you, Senator Bromm, that we're dealing with on these rules. Brothers and sisters, sometimes we don't even pay attention after I have done so much talking and said pay attention but, see, you don't pay attention to me so I understand it.
