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Act bills and petroleum product bills. Now I would not stand here and tell you that we are as busy as the Judiciary Committee, and we may not be any busier than some of the two-day committees, like Education and Transportation, but some of the subject matters are pretty complicated. At least I have found them to be so. Maybe they are simple for other people, but they are not for me. And then we come to the question of what do other states do. Well, we are the only state with a Unicameral, so we're different, and that's not all bad. I kind of looked at the states, I've got a list of all 50 of them here if you would want to come and look at them. I didn't distribute that list. Colorado is one of the few states that combines Agriculture and Natural Resources. Illinois has an Agriculture and Conservation Committee and an Environment and Energy Committee. Indiana has an Agriculture and Business Committee and an Environmental Affairs Committee and a Natural Resources Committee. Actually, the Natural Resources Committee of the Nebraska Legislature is probably more encompassing than most states. Most states, a lot of states divide that up into two or three committees. Iowa has an Agriculture Committee and a Natural Resources and Environment Committee. Kansas has an Agriculture Committee and an Energy and Natural Resources Committee. Michigan has a Farming, Agribusiness, and Flood Systems Committee. It has an Environment and Natural Resources Committee, and an Energy and a Technology Committee. Minnesota has an Agriculture and Rural Development Committee and an Environment and Natural Resources Committee. Missouri has an Agriculture, Conservation, Parks and Tourism Committee and a Commerce and Environment Committee. South Dakota does merge the two. It has an Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: North Dakota has an Agriculture Committee and a Natural Resources Committee. Wisconsin, I think, has the most interesting one. It has an Agricultural, Environmental Resources, and Campaign Finance Reform Committee. Now you figure that one out. Wyoming has three committees. It has an Agricultural, Public Lands and Water Resources Committee. It has a Mineral, Business and Economic Development Committee, and it has a Travel, Recreation, Wildlife and Cultural Resources Committee. Now I don't know if this meant much to any of you,
