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Senator Brown said, a statement must be made and a statement is being made. And statements are made all the time on behalf of the big shots that she often speaks for, like Caterpillar and some of these others that want to get all those tax incentives; they would not want that legislation put in a committee dominated by people like me, because the first thing they'd say is, it never has a chance to get out, because that's what they're interested in, it is their ox that would be gored. But when it comes to that element in the state which is to be dismissed, which is not to be...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...taken too seriously, then everybody can bat it around and say, well, yeah, it belongs over here because it fits. But I think there is a better fit between Appropriations and Revenue. Mr. President, I'm going to ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would all members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. Would those individuals not authorized please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Bourne, Senator Brashear, Senator Lynch, Senator Matzke, Senator Schimek, Senator Schmitt, the house is under call. Senator Smith, Senator Thompson, Senator Wehrbein, the house is under call. Senator Engel, Senator Hartnett, the house is under call. The house is under call. Would all members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. The question before us is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the Rules Committee amendment to the permanent rules. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is not agreed to. The call is raised. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your
