talking to children. Now those are the kinds of games that are played with children, using child psychology. But it is not the kind of argument given by a mature, thoughtful person to other mature, thoughtful people. Now a mature, thoughtful person might give that argument, if he or she mistakes the audience receiving it as being children. But you see, children are not even taken in by child psychology, only adults. So, for those who have stood up here and said that the interests of agriculture are going to be better served by being put into a committee that has more and bigger interests, numberwise and otherwise, that argument makes no sense, but that's the only one they can give. It's like when I was trying to get district elections, so that black people could have somebody of our choice on the city council, the school board, and the county board. And with the help of my colleagues, all of those subdivisions are now elected by district, and we've place black people on all of them, and women have gotten elected to some of them who had never been elected to any of them before. They were telling us it's better for you to be able to vote for seven, none of whom has your interests at heart, than to vote for one of your choosing. In other words, no vote is better than a certain vote. So what the people who represent ag's interests are being told is that you're better off if you have no vote, but you're put on a committee whose main thrust is not the interests of ag. You're going to represent agriculture better because the committee has a longer name now, Agriculture, Environment and Natural Resources. And when your constituents see that on your stationary, they'll say, oooo-wee, Senator Dierks has all these names on this committee of which he's a member; it sure must be powerful. But somebody else will say what I have learned in my experience, that the longer the name, generally, the lesser the power. You all have seen these names of an assistant deputy to the associate helper of the CEO in charge of assistants. That's a person who does nothing. But when you come to determine the most powerful country on the face of the earth, kill power, money power, they say it's the United States of America, therefore the person who is most powerful in the world is the person who heads that country. And, brothers and sisters, when that person is introduced, all they say, they use one word, ladies and gentlemen, the President of the United States. President is all, president is all you need. You can even abbreviate the words in a big shot's term or title, CEO,
