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beginning of another century either. I don't know why people do that? To explain it to children, because I was talking to them, because they thought since it said 2000, it was the beginning of the next century. I said, if you've got 200 pennies and 100 pennies make a dollar, how many pennies do you count up to before you have a whole dollar? They said, 100. I said then you need 101...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...before you start on the next dollar. They said, that's right, and then they understood it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) Continued discussion on the Chambers amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Mr. President, I stand corrected. We're right where we usually are by the end of the session, I'm offering my amendments, going 100 miles an hour, into my zone, growing stronger and stronger, and my presentations become longer and longer, my colleagues begin to get glassy-eyed and have that unspoken question written across their face, when will this all end? Well, remember, brothers and sisters, I did not bring this to us. But you-all know that when something is brought to me and I think it's important, I'm going to treat it with the importance and seriousness that I think it merits. And I think this that's being presented is very serious. So what my amendment is designed to do is to create two committees as I have described them. Now, everything that relates to urban matters, the big shots stealing from the treasury, Senator Brown will have a chance to represent them because she'll be probably a member of the Urban Affairs Committee, those who are worried about Ag being pressed down and ignored will be in a position to do something about that, because they'll be on the Ag and Rural Affairs Committee. And they can keep an eye on each other, and they'll be able to see some of those who come from rural areas who don't really have the interests of the rural community at heart, because they'll all be there watching and seeing how votes are actually cast. And sometimes it's necessary to keep an honest person honest to keep an eye on that honest person
