be some kind of structural change within the committee systems and I would still argue that this is far and away the most logical proposition that you could have before you. But, having said all those things, I hope there's some other lights on because I don't think it would...I don't think anyone is ready...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to exactly vote on this at this particular point in time, but I would be interested, and I'm sure others on the Rules Committee would be interested in any ideas you might care to articulate today on how this could be made better. You know, I really think that there is some obligation on your part to suggest reasonable alternatives to the Rules Committee to work out, because, frankly, those alternatives are few and far between and I...but I would be interested if there was one that would seem to be a reasonable alternative. So I think that's where the matter sits and hopefully we can work through this tomorrow. Thank you.
