Massachusetts and California have all experienced. The record is clear. Raise the price, consumption goes down, teen smoking is blunted in its growth. That's incontestable and, by the way, if there was a single piece of evidence to the contrary in the last two hours, I missed it and I was listening very carefully, and there's probably \$100,000 being spent to lobby this bill and if they knew where to find that statistic, they would have brought it to you. It doesn't exist. There are too many resources allayed against this bill that if they could find that fact, they would have found it and brought it to you, but it doesn't exist. Price affects consumption and teen smoking and there's...that record is indisputable. Here's what I'd suggest that you do because I recognize the realities. I've listened to the floor debate and it is not fact-filled, it is opinion and value, so let's get to values. You've got a bunch of angry citizens, they're smokers, they don't like this bill. You've heard from them, I've heard from them. You've got a pile of letters, you've got some e-mails. Put them in one pile. Take out 30 cents and put it in the middle because that's how much this is going to add to the cost of a pack of cigarettes, and money is part of the deal. And then take out a picture of your grandchildren or your children and put it on the other side. You've got one in your wallet. You've got a picture of your "grandkids" in your wallet, don't you, or your children? Take it out and then say which of those three piles is most important. Is it the angry citizens? Sixty-eight percent of the population support this bill and 40 percent of smokers support this bill. Is it the 30 cents and the commercial interests who may lose some money for border bleeding? Or is it that picture on the left of your "grandkids" and your kids? And you know what? Every one of the 3,500 to 4,000 kids now alive in Nebraska whose lives will be lengthened are somebody's children and somebody's grandchildren. And that picture is just...it's just a way of making clear to you what those children are to somebody else, because there's about 3,500 to 4,000 of them whose lives will be lengthened by adopting this amendment and passing this bill on. Of those three piles, the angry letters, and they exist and, by the way, the check that's, you know, for elections, it's in that pile; the 30 cents, the commercial interests, the border bleeding problem and the picture of your "grandkids", because that...this bill is a choice between those three piles. My choice is on the left-hand
