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way of using our money. We're collecting all this data. We're putting money into women's health and how are we doing that? Are we sure that we're looking at the right amount of money to be put into the right amount of disease? I don't know. We don't have anybody that coordinates and cooperates and looks at all of this. We have to look at also the ability of this group to raise money and then Senator Tyson's wonderful concern of whether there's going to be enough tax money to do this for his extra FTE will not be a problem. Why would anyone be against helping a department, an agency, the size of Health and Human Services? Health and Human Services is our biggest department. This bill is to help them. It's not to denigrate them. It's not to find fault with them. It's to help them. They are to collect data and spend our tax money where it will be used the most and do the most good. I don't understand why any agency would be against that. I don't understand why any senator would be against spending money efficiently and for the purpose that would do the most people the most good. Most of the spending tracks that you will look at on the back of the Health and Human Service System memo deals with reproductive parts of a woman. We are more than our reproductive parts. We die mostly from heart disease. Heart disease is not part of our reproductive parts. I do believe that if we studied heart disease in women that we might approach how we fund women's projects and women's healthcare in a different way. That's what this bill is about. It is about an opportunity for a commission to raise private money to help the Health and Human Services System to work better and more efficiently, and is that not what we are about as legislators?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SUTTLE: We absolutely must look at this logically and not look at ancillary problems that don't exist. Asking the department to concentrate on spending their money efficiently is not an onerous task for them. That's what they do. They do it pretty well, and I think this bill is just a way to enhance their ability to do a good job. Thank you.
