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Committee. We're talking about...

SENATOR TYSON: What are we spend...Senator.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Pardon?

SENATOR TYSON: Can I...can I ask?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Certainly.

SENATOR TYSON: How much did we spend on women's health in that same period of time?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I don't have a clue.

SENATOR TYSON: Neither do I. I thought perhaps you were going to make a comparison here.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I'm asking...all I'm asking this body for is a staff person, Senator Tyson, and the fiscal note is going to be less than the fiscal note was last year. In addition, it's going to be less than that if you adopt my amendment because we're really talking about one staff person here. It's...it's going to be, I'm guessing, around \$100,000 a year.

SENATOR TYSON: (Gasp!) Please. Please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So, I guess I'm not trying to pick on the Wheat Board, I don't want to pick on any other board or commission. I think they can...if they can justify their existence and they're doing a service to the state, I have no problem with that. All I'm trying to, I guess, say to you is that 52 percent of the population in this state is women, there are a lot of reasons that we need to focus in this arena, and this is a very modest proposal. Please don't cut it any more.
