more immigrants come in. The job of the Health and Human Services System gets larger every year. We have children's health problems, we have women's health problems, and we have men's health problems. Senator Coordsen told me one time in a conversation that I was having with him that he didn't like to pit one group against another. We're not pitting anybody against anything. We're trying to catch up. We have been at the tail end of priority for a very long time, "we" being women. I would like to see that the executive director shall do this. And the policy secretary of the Health and Human Services System, by the way, is a woman. She will be the one that will give the directive.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SUTTLE: She is already trying to work towards this. I've had conversations with her. She is a past colleague of ours. She understands this process and knows the importance of this. This secretary of policy is someone who understands the picture and understands under which we...the rules we work, and I think that she will find that this is a wonderful tool for her to use to enhance and complement the job that the Health and Human Services System is already doing. SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I...this goes back. I need to clarify a statement made by Senator Schimek. I apparently am the only member of the Nebraska Wheat Growers in the body here, but I would be chastised if I didn't correct a statement she made. We have a one and one-quarter cent per bushel checkoff on every bushel of wheat grown in the state of Nebraska, regardless of the variety. It's collected at the time we sell the wheat. We fund the Nebraska Wheat Utilization and Promotion Board, I think is what it's officially called, through checkoffs. There is no General Fund money appropriated to the Nebraska Wheat Board. Thank you.
