Senator Schimek. That was AM1749 and we had pending an amendment from Senator Tyson that had been divided. We're now considering the second component of that division which is FA263. (AM1749, Legislative Journal page 2026, First Session; FA263, Legislative Journal page 269.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Discussion on Part 2 of the divided Tyson amendment. Senator Tyson, would you like to bring us up to date on the amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body. We are discussing the second division which strikes the word "requires" and inserts the word "allows". I think that has been amply laid out for the members of the body and, unless Senator Schimek wishes to go further with that discussion, I see no point in continuing to labor the argument. And while I cannot do so, if someone wishes to call the question on that, I think it would be a good idea.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you for that recap, Senator Tyson. Is there any discussion on the divided...second part of the divided question? Senator Tyson, you're recognized to close on the amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Again, I think that it was adequately explained. I would ask the chair for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Tyson. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays, to go under call.
