PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: There are no other lights on. Senator Tyson, to close on this part of the...of your divided amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body. I think this is clear enough that everyone can understand it, that everyone can draw his own conclusions and that everyone can vote accordingly. I will mention in passing that Senator Chambers has accused me of propogandizing this. It is not so. This...the original bill was bad, Senator Schimek's amendment doesn't make it greatly better but this makes it somewhat acceptable. This is still a bill that provides for redundant governor...government services and the expenditure of tax money that need not be spent, but the point at hand is the third division of the question and I urge you to think about it and cast your vote as you see fit in this matter. I would ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is, shall the...do you want to use the balance of your time then, Senator Tyson? Are you...

SENATOR TYSON: No, I don't believe so.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: You're finished? Okay, thank you, Senator Tyson. Question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 13 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would all members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Would unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. (Visitors introduced.) The house is under call. Would members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. Senator Bromm, the house is under call. Senator Wickersham, the house is under call. The house is under call, Senator Bromm, Senator Wickersham. The question is, shall the third part of the divided Tyson amendment to the Schimek amendment to LB 480 be adopted? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.
