SENATOR COORDSEN: I don't know the particular instance, but I would say that it would make a difference in that case, if it was currently being valued as an acreage, whatever the value that's assessed to those in your county.

SENATOR JONES: I could visit with them again. You spoke about an acre there. A house for pretty good size, for an acre it's 43,270 square feet an acre, so that would be a pretty good size house.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I thought an acre was 16 1/2 feet wide and 1 mile long, (laugh) half a mile long, pardon me.

SENATOR JONES: Oh, (laugh) (inaudible).

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yeah, half a mile long.

SENATOR COORDSEN: But that's why I used roughly a city block because we can all visualize that. I might mention...excuse me, it's not my turn.
