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of the acres at a lesser amount. And so, if they're valued as contiguous farm ground, it might have the potential for me, personally, of increasing the value of the real estate on some of the farm sites. So that exists out there, too, depending on...depending on where that is located in the state of Nebraska. Thank you, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Coordsen, your light is on next.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Now, I would like to continue the conversation with Senator Beutler, if I may. Senator Beutler, but I've forgotten where we left off.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I...Sen...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Will you turn Senator Beutler's mike on, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler. It's on, Senator.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yeah, okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, if I recall correctly, you were about to indicate to what extent, if any,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...there may...well, first of all,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I assume there is, within a taxing jurisdiction, only a shift within the district with any change that this might bring about. And to the extent, and if that is true, then do we have any figures or know anything about how much of a shift between...how much of a shift that this might be?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, the answer to your first question would be it would result in, I suspect, a minor shift. Where we've had a shift the other way, I think the main impact was two years ago. It would go back to what it was probably three years ago.
